

2025 Policy Priorities

Enhancing our laws to promote meaningful change for victims and survivors.

PROSECUTION of Human Traffickers.

- Strengthen the prosecution of sex buyers, facilitators and traffickers by simplifying Chapter 30 of the crimes code.
 - Repeal § 3013: Patronizing a victim of Sexual Servitude.
 On February 12, 2024, the act "patronizes" was added to § 3011 rendering this section obsolete.
 - Streamline § 5902: Prostitution and related offenses.
 Move all trafficking related sections to Chapter 30, creating 3 new sections: § 3027 Promoting prostitution, § 3028 Living off a person in prostitution, and § 3029 Engaging a person for prostitution.
 - Remove grading increase for persons in prostitution.
- Remove the defense for lack of knowledge of the victim's age completely from § 3018.

PREVENTION of Human Trafficking.

- Call for appropriations: the General Assembly must appropriate funds to roll out a state-wide public awareness campaign, including the **anti-demand campaign** referred to in § 3064(a)(4)(ii), the Safe Harbor for Sexually Exploited Children Fund.
- **Consolidate funds:** combine the funds enumerated in § 3031 and § 3064 into one fund to be managed by the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency.

PROTECTION of Victims and Survivors.

- Provide meaningful protections for victims and survivors by expanding vacatur and affirmative defense remedies in § 3019.
 - **Expand vacatur** so that victims are eligible to vacate any offense committed as a result of being a victim of human trafficking.
 - **Expand the Affirmative Defense** to apply to all crimes a victim may commit as a direct result of human trafficking, not just prostitution.
- Amend § 3020 so that victims are eligible to receive restitution by removing the caveat for expected earnings
 from illegal activity. Sex trafficking victims are not culpable for crimes their traffickers force them to
 commit.
